Mercenary scientists, he argue have increasingly shaped and skewed the technical literature, manufactured ar magnified scientific uncertainty, and influenced government policy to the advantagof polluters and the manufacturers of dagerous products.

To keep the public confused abo the hazards posed by global warmin secondhand smoke, asbestos, lead, platics, and many other toxic materia industry executives have hired unscrup lous scientists and lobbyists to dispute t scientific evidence that would alert t public to these dangers. Their goal is t manufacture of doubt.

Such reckless practices have lo existed, but Michaels argues that the Bu administration has deepened the dysfur tion by virtually handing over regulate agencies to the very corporate power whose products and behavior they a charged with overseeing. The agencies rely on to protect our air, water, food, a medications have become unable or, some cases, unwilling to do their jobs.

Michaels writes from a unique vanta point—as a scientist and former gove ment regulator, he has been a leader the efforts to protect the public from ceases caused by artificial butter fla ("popcorn lung"), beryllium, chromit and a host of other hazards. In *Doub Their Product* he proves, beyond a dot that our regulatory system is brok Michaels offers concrete proposals how it can be restored by taking the ptics out of science and ensuring that cern for public health and safety guinour regulatory policy.



David Michaels is an epidemiologist and the director of the Project on Scientific Knowledge and Public Policy at The George Washington University School of Public Health and Health Services. During the Clinton administration he served as Assistant Secretary of Energy for Environment, Safety, and Health, responsible for protecting the health and safety of workers. neighboring communities, and the environment surrounding the nation's nuclear weapons facilities. He was the architect of the historic initiative that "made peace with the past," compensating U.S. nuclear weapons workers for illnesses developed while making or testing atomic weapons. In 2006 Michaels received the American Association for the Advancement of Science's Scientific Freedom and Responsibility Award. He lives in Bethesda, Maryland.
